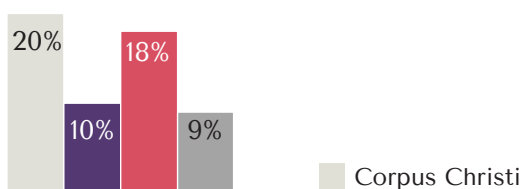

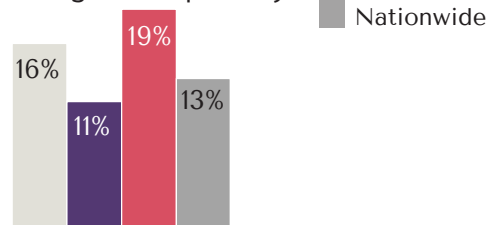
Corpus Christi: 326,586

### STATE OF HEALTH CARE



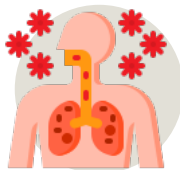
- Texas has the highest percentage of uninsured people in the country
- Texas has one of the lowest numbers of primary care physicians in the country based on population
- More than 1.6 million Texans have been diagnosed with asthma

### LUNG HEALTH CARE



- Asthma rates were twice as high for Black children in Texas compared to White and Hispanic children
- In 2020, 202 lung transplants were performed in Texas, ranking third in the country. At the same time, 217 Texans joined the wait list for a lung transplant

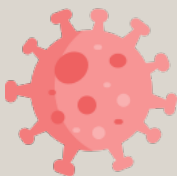
### LUNG DISEASE IN TEXAS



- Eleven percent of adults in the Houston, San Antonio and Corpus Christi areas are living with chronic lung disease.
- Low-income people in Texas are more than twice as likely to suffer from COPD
- Chronic lower respiratory disease was responsible for 10,800 deaths for every 100,000 people in Texas
